Lake John Wells

Sitting just along the edge of southeastern Stigler, Lake John Wells is the perfect place to enjoy outdoor activities with family and friends.

With 220-acres, the lake provides the perfect environment for camping, hiking, skiing, and fishing.

The lake is equipped with spider blocks set up on the west end of the lake, creating a miniature habitat that can enhance the fishing experience.

People can grill by the lake, use the playground and camp atop the hill.

Kerr Lake

Sitting on the Arkansas River, the Robert S. Kerr Reservoir expands through western Haskell County and areas north of Keota.

The shore line spans 250 miles with scenic spots and boat ramps in areas near Keota and Tamaha.

With its draw being catfish and bass, Kerr Lake has become a prime fishing spot for tournaments. The lake also has a prime hiking trail near Short Mountain Cove and three swimming beaches, including one at Cowlington Point.

The Army Corps of Engineers manages 10,730 acres for hunting.

Facilities: Boat ramps, picnic areas, RV and tent campsites, drinking water, group shelters, restrooms, swimming beaches, change houses, electric outlets and concession services.



Lake Eufaula

Located 27 miles upstream from the confluence of the Arkansas River is Oklahoma's biggest lake and the 12th largest reservoir in surface area in the United States, Lake Eufaula. With several marinas, boat ramps, houseboat rental, paddle boats, ski boats and pontoons, Lake Eufaula is the perfect place to spend the summer months with family and friends.

The lake has a high number of trout, catfish, bass and crappie making it a dream spot for fishermen.

Activities: Boating, camping, environmental education, fishing, hiking, horseback riding, hotel/lodge/resort privately owned, picnicking, playground park, water sports and wildlife viewing.
