STIGLER REGIONAL AIRPORT

The Stigler Regional Airport has grown incrementally in its 42-year history. Located half a mile north of Highway 9, the 80-acre airport has a 4,298-foot asphalt runway.

"Having regional status allows bigger, faster planes to access the community," said Airport Trust President Randy Harrison. With its size, the airport can take private jets.

Stigler Regional Airport has all of the qualities of a fine regional airport, with GPS instrument approaches, regularly inspected runway lights, a strong locating beacon and secure gates around the facility.

This spring, the airport will have a complete runway overlay. There are currently five

based single-engine aircraft, one multi-engine aircraft and four helicopters. In the year ending May 31, 2013, the airport had 6,600 aircraft operations, which is 18 per day. Flight schools use it as a practice runway.

The airport property has land available for leasing for hangar use and light industry. Located 25 miles away from Interstate 40, the airport is a nice place for industry storage.

Stigler Regional Airport is owned by the city and receives funding, but is also supported by donations and maintained by local pilots and airplane enthusiasts. "The government likes to see interest and involvement from the community," said Harrison.
